The Collection:

The Lowndes County World War II Collection, 1942-1978 (MS 487) consists of materials relating to the Lowndes County, Mississippi experience during World War II (WWII), both domestically and on the war front. Materials include three war ration booklets, one WWII Blue Star flag, two scrapbooks with newspaper clippings, and nineteen black and white photographs of local soldiers.

The original creator of each scrapbook is unclear. However, several names associated with the collection include James Talton Locke, Jr., Thomas Arthur Brown, Katherine Lee Hudson Brown, and Olivia Katherine Brown Carson. It is possible that the scrapbooks in this collection were created by Locke himself or his family. The Brown family owned the three war ration booklets in the collection.

The two scrapbooks consist of newspaper clippings largely documenting the lives of Lowndes County soldiers, both men and women, in training, their military service, awards, visits home, and casualties. The articles also detail the domestic front with local fundraising efforts, the birth of children, businesses, family visits with soldiers, and more.

In 2025, Joseph Henson, Local History Department volunteer, processed the Lowndes County World War II Collection. He also began indexing volume I, but was unable to continue his volunteer work soon thereafter. Archivist Mona Vance-Ali completed the indexing of volumes I and II throughout 2025 and 2026. The scrapbooks were digitized by Vance-Ali and Gary Lancaster, Local History Assistant, using a Nikon D-750 camera in 2025.

Each scrapbook contains its own independent index for corresponding volume along with an abbreviations page. Each index captures the names, titles, page numbers, and notes of individuals found within the two scrapbooks. The page numbers were assigned by the indexer and added to each digital image.

Operational Notes:

1. Page numbers are most often located on the bottom right-hand side of the image and occasionally positioned in the bottom left-hand side or upper right-hand side of the image.
2. Loose newspaper articles include the corresponding page number followed by an alphabetical letter. For example, "10B".
3. Nicknames are in quotations even if the original is in parentheses.
4. When a name appears in more than one article on the same scrapbook page, then there is a number to the right of the page number in parentheses to indicate the number of articles in which the name appears on a specific page within the scrapbook. For example, "32(3)".
5. In Volume II, the last thirteen newspaper clippings are loose inside the back cover of the book. The digital image of those clippings includes, in the lower right-hand corner, the letters "BC" before the alphabetical letter following it such as "BC D". The letters "BC" stands for "Back Cover" to denote location. The alphabetical letter indicates a new individual clipping.
