Autism Spectrum Disorder

1 in 59 children have been identified with an Autism Spectrum Disorder

ASDs occur in all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups

ASDs are almost 4 times more common among boys (1 in 37) than among girls (1 in 151)

Parents who have a child with an ASD have up to an 18% chance of having a second child with ASD

**AUTISM IN
MISSISSIPPI**

In 2017, an estimated 11,000 children in Mississippi were identified as having ASD.

Throughout the state of Mississippi, families and systems of care are struggling to meet the needs of individuals with ASD.
